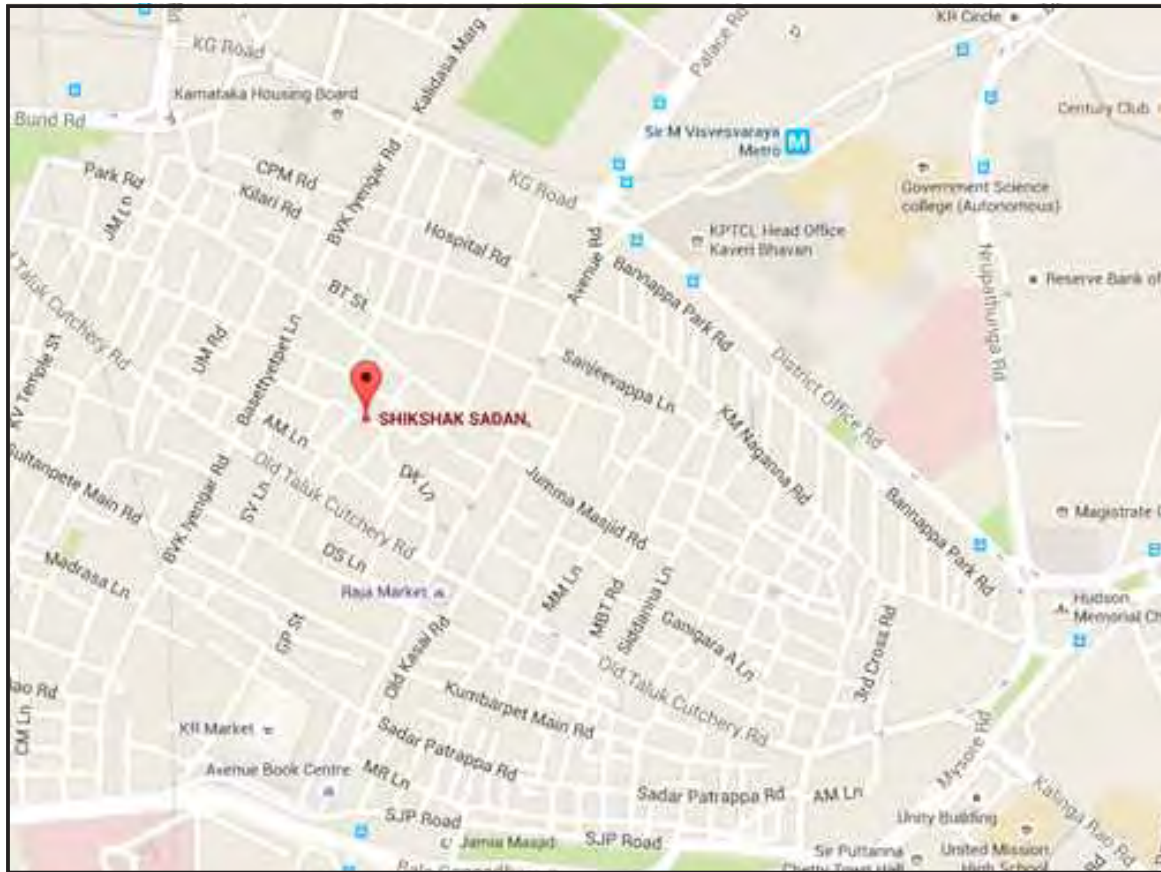

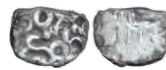

From the above it can be inferred that Vikramasena was the last major ruler of the Traikutaka Dynasty as we do not get any more references of Kings from other inscriptions.
